Kindergarten Round-up

Spread the word: Kindergarten Round-up is scheduled for April 30 - May 1. On Tuesday the 30th, there will be a morning and afternoon sessions beginning at 8:30 a.m. and noon. On Wednesday the 1st, we will have an afternoon session with Spanish translator available at noon. Later on Wednesday, we are offering a 4:00 p.m. opportunity to complete the registration process.

The student must be 5 by September 1, 2019 to be eligible. The clinic consists of a two-hour period during which the students will participate in a variety of skill assessments and health checks.

Parents will be asked to fill out pre-registration paperwork at that time.

Parents need to bring the following:

- Certified birth certificate
- current immunization record
- 2 proofs of residence that show your physical address

Also on **Friday**, **May 10**, there is a special **Kindergarten Visitation** day. Parents bring students to the school at 12:30 and return for pick up at 2:30. During that time, students rotate through various activities. They will visit the playground, read a story and write a little. The finale is a short bus ride around Wickenburg.

It is important to note that the District uses these preregistration numbers to determine Hassayampa staff needs for next school year. Although it may seem optional, this early registration process assists the school in making many important decisions. Please call the Hassayampa office to pre-register today!

Is your child ready for state testing?

All year students have been learning the AZ Standards as taught by their classroom teachers. Through Galileo benchmark testing, teachers are able to determine how students are progressing in learning the standards.

State testing will begin April 1 and continue through April 18. Yes, this is a long testing window, but students aren't testing each day. Please consider the testing schedule when making doctor and dentist appointments. If you know your child will be out, please let your child's teacher know ahead of time. On testing days, please make sure your child has a healthy breakfast and gets plenty of rest the night before.

AIMS Science - 4th grade

4th grade students took the AIMS Science test online like the AzMERIT during the last week of March.

AZMERIT - 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades

3rd-5th grade students will be tested using the state test, AzMERIT. This test is designed to measure student learning and progress towards readiness for college or career. Reading, writing, and math will be assessed in an online format. As Hassayampa has two computer labs, the tests will be given over several days.

TEST TIPS

The following is a short list of tips to help your child perform at his/her highest level.

- Send your child to school every day.
 There are makeup dates available, but it has been proven that students perform better when they are in their regular educational environment.
- 2) Make sure your student arrives on time.
 Once a class begins a testing session, no tardy students will be sent to class. They will have to stay in the office for the remainder of the session and make up the test at a later date.
- 3) Schedule appointments and absences outside of the testing dates. Students who leave school before completing a particular testing session, including those students who leave due to illness, are ineligible to continue that portion of the test and cannot be permitted to finish it when they return to school.
- 4) Make sure your child gets plenty of sleep.
- 5) Make sure your child gets a healthy breakfast.

Your student has been working hard all year mastering grade level concepts. Please do everything you can to aid in his/her success. Our students are ready to show what they know!



Raising Expectations Policy

This district policy was enacted to focus attention on the value of academic achievement and to increase accountability. In order to meet the expectations of this policy, Hassayampa celebrates those students who are Proficient and Highly Proficient on Galileo. Also, we offer tutoring to specifically identified students who require academic assistance. Your student may be required to attend summer school based upon not meeting the goals measured through Galileo.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

We hope you had a relaxing and restful Spring Break. School is now in session for the 4th quarter and we are hoping to finish out this year with a bang! For some students, the end of the year is a difficult stretch. It's hard to keep focused on school work with the gorgeous weather outside! Yet this is not the time to give up on good study habits.

As a parent, it's important to make sure there are procedures in place at home so that kids can get their work completed for the following day. Even the most challenged of students can benefit from improved study habits when a routine is in place.

Are you asking yourself where to begin? Encouragement is a great way to start the process. Children need to know that the adults in their lives are there to support and believe in them. Having the right attitude is especially important when beginning any assignment. Secondly, set up a designated study space that is only used for that purpose. You may want to consider your child's individual learning style and think about if the space helps to support it. Try to match up the study space with their personality as well. Establishing a routine early in elementary school can help tremendously when students get older and their assignments become more rigorous. We hope to see our largest number of honor roll students at the end of the last quarter! Help your child reach their potential by ensuring that success starts at home first.

Internet Safety Tips From Parenting Magazine:

Monitor the Pictures Your Child Posts Online

In an ideal world, your child would never post a photo of herself online, but that might not be entirely realistic. If she wants to share photos with her friends via email or a social networking site, be sure you know exactly which pictures are being posted. Make sure the content of the photo is completely innocuous and that no identifiable locales in the background are noticeable.

Limit Cell Phone Use

Just as you would limit use of a computer, TV or gaming system, you can do the same with a cell phone. Set rules for the device, only allowing cell phone usage at certain hours in the evening or after homework has been completed. If you have teens of driving age, the most important rule to enforce is that under no circumstances should cell phones ever be used while driving. Phones should be kept off so incoming text sounds aren't a distraction or should be kept in the glove compartment, out of reach.
