## HB 2732 "Move on When Reading"

In May 2010, voters passed Proposition 100. Part of the proposition was a requirement that all third graders in the school year 2013-14 will be required to pass the AIMS reading test in order to be promoted to the next grade level. Parents of students in grades K-2



who are substantially deficient in reading will receive written notification each quarter. It is our hope to help parents know if their child is substantially deficient in reading.

Also, it is our intent to provide information on how Hassayampa teachers are working with your children to get them up to level to pass the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade AzMERIT reading test. In addition, Hassayampa will provide parents with specific information on the deficient areas of reading along with strategies parents can use to help their child at home. To learn more about your child's progress, please attend our parent-teacher conferences at the end of the month. Remember, you can contact your child's teacher any time with your questions regarding your child's progress. Together, we can achieve success for your child!

#### Raising Expectations Policy

Our 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC program supports our Raising Expectations policy. Students identified as having academic deficits attend before/ after school programs for support.

Along with offering support, we also celebrate accomplishments of students. Therefore, during the Honors Assembly, Hassayampa will be celebrating students who demonstrated proficiency of the Arizona standards on AzMERIT last spring.



# Character Counts! Lessons

During Library once a month, students learn about the pillars of good character. This month the focus is on Trustworthiness.

Teaching your child to be trustworthy doesn't happen overnight. Instead, it is something you should model every day. How do you do that? You do that with consistent interaction.

Your children can learn about telling the truth, respecting property of others and keeping their promises. When you pay attention to and model these behaviors every day, your child will develop into a trustworthy individual.

Your child should understand that trustworthiness is a complicated idea but it is essential to meaningful relationships, long-lasting friendships, and successful associations in school and in the workplace. Talk to your child about the three major qualities of trustworthiness and discuss situations that you both face that challenge each of these qualities.

- **Honesty** telling the truth and doing what is right even if no one else is doing it
- Promise-keeping keeping your word and being dependable
- **Loyalty** standing by, sticking up for and protecting family, friends and country; being a good friend and looking out for those who care about you.

#### A Note from our Health Aide

To help prevent the spread of lice, here are some steps you can take:

- Avoid direct head-to-head contact with anyone know to have live, crawling lice.
- Do not share hair-related personal items.
- Avoid sleepovers and slumber parties during lice outbreaks.
- After finishing treatment with lice medicine, check everyone in your family for lice after one week. Be sure to talk to your healthcare provider about treatments for those who have lice.
- Machine-wash any bedding and clothing used by anyone having lice.

Teachers are using the Synergy gradebook to calculate students' grades electronically. Synergy is the student management system used by the Wickenburg Unified School District to keep student information, like attendance and grades. One component of Synergy is the teacher gradebook. There are many advantages to using an electronic grade book. Teachers have access to information about their students' assignments, missing assignments, grades, class averages, and up-to-date grades.

The use of Synergy also allows information to be shared with parents through **ParentVUE**. With a user ID and password, parents can have the ability to see their child's grade for each subject, missing assignments, and grade for a particular assignment plus many other things. You can keep up on your child's progress from your computer at home or your cell phone. When you come for parent-teacher conferences or any time, please stop by the front office for assistance in getting more information on this useful tool.
