#### DIBELS & MFF Benchmark Week

Starting **December 3**, Hassayampa students will be participating in our mid-year assessment measures. Rest assured that, even though testing occurs over the week, these tests take very little time. DIBELS is the measure we use to determine if students are on track in reading. It is mostly an individual test, and takes **fewer than 15 minutes** per student. Math Fact Fluency takes fewer than **5 minutes**. These assessments will provide teachers specific information on how individual students are progressing as well as how the entire grade level and school is doing.

#### Holiday Sale

With PTA support, Hassayampa will be hosting the annual Holiday Sale. This is an opportunity for students to shop for



inexpensive gifts for family members. Most gifts are in the \$0.50 to \$15.00 price range. Students will be given an opportunity to shop for items starting on December 17 through 20.

#### Just a few reminders:

**Emergency Contact Information:** If your address or phone number (work, home, or cell) changes, please let the school office know so that files can be updated. Many times the office or health aide is not able to reach parents when their child is ill. It is a difficult situation for both the student and health aide.

**Dress for the Weather**: The weather has been incredible; however, mornings at Hassayampa are chilly! Please make sure you send your child in clothes that fit the temps. #### "Move on When Reading"

Parents of students in grades K-3 who are substantially deficient in reading will receive written notification each quarter. It is our



hope to help parents know if their child is substantially deficient in reading. Also, it is our intent to provide information on how Hassayampa teachers are working with their child to get them up to level to pass the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade state reading test. In addition, Hassayampa will provide parents with specific information on the deficient areas of reading along with strategies parents can use to help their child at home.

#### AZMERIT - State Assessment

Wickenburg students in Grades 3 through high school will take the AzMERIT in English Language Arts and Mathematics each spring.

To ensure your child is able to do his/her best, there are some simple things you can do to help.

- \* Make sure your child practices math and reading fluency measures daily.
- \* Encourage your child to read daily!
  - If you get a new family game, let your child read the instructions to everyone that participates.
  - Your child can also read the holiday cards to the family.
  - $\,\circ\,$  Are you traveling over the winter break? This is a great time to read and discuss new books.
  - Christmas is a great time to explore other cultures. Spend some time reading books about traditions in other countries and cultures.
  - Search for and begin a new tradition in your family. Books are a great resource.
  - Reading doesn't always have to include books. Try the internet for limitless research. Remember to sit with your child to help them search safely.
- \* Make sure your child gets plenty of rest and a good nutritious breakfast all week.
- \* Communicate regularly with your child's teacher.
- \* If you have any questions about the mid-year expectations, you can contact your child's teacher or Ms. Henneman or Ms. Griswold.

This is a busy time of year, but also a great time to spend quality time with your child.

#### **BOOK Fair!**

It's nearly time for the Book Fair! Starting the week of **January 28**, every student will have an opportunity to shop during their scheduled library time. Also, students will be able to shop before school from 7:30 to 8 a.m. on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Additionally, parents will have the opportunity to shop during our Art & Science Night on Thursday, January 31 at 6 p.m.

Information on how parents and students can make a wish list by visiting the book fair website will sent home in January.



Once the website link is available, purchases may be completed from the

book fair website, click on the blue button to access the online book fair. It will be available BEFORE and AFTER the in-school fair. From here, you may order the same books that you can at the in-school fair. All books ordered online will be shipped to the school free of charge and delivered to the student named in the order.

Arizona Revised Statute (A.R.S.) 43-1089.01 allows individual taxpayers to receive a tax credit up to \$400.00 (joint return) for payment to a fund set aside for extra-curricular activities fees. Generally, any educational or recreational activity that is a supplement to the educational program of the school is considered to be an extra-curricular activity. This is a dollar for dollar tax credit. It allows you, the taxpayer, to decide where you would like to put up to \$400.00 of your tax dollars to work. When it comes time to fill out your tax forms, you will receive a tax credit for up to \$400.00. It is a win-win situation for yourself and the school activities you support with your tax dollars. You do not have to have a child in school so grandparents or anyone can also take advantage of this tax credit.

#### Questions and Answers:

What public schools and grades are eligible for the credit?

Public schools that provide instruction in grades kindergarten through 12 are eligible for the credit. What is a fee paid for the support of extracurricular activities? A fee is a dollar amount paid to a public school for the support of extracurricular activities.

#### What are extraCurriCular activities?

Extracurricular activities means school sponsored activities that require enrolled students to pay a fee in order to participate. Such activities may include, but are not limited to use of band uniforms, use of equipment or uniforms for athletics, or use of scientific laboratory equipment or materials. Any educational /recreational activities that supplement the educational program of the school.

#### If a school establishes a fund to pay for extraCurriCular activities, would a payment to this fund qualify for a tax credit?

Yes, the credit is authorized for fees paid by any taxpayer to a public school for the support of extracurricular activities.

# Must a taxpayer have a Child enrolled in order to Claim the tax Credit?

No, a taxpayer is any person subject to tax.

# What is the Claim limit for a married couple?

The credit claimed by married couples filing a joint return is limited to a maximum of \$400.00. Married couples filing separate tax returns can claim only one-half of the allowable credit on each return.

# What kind of receipt will I receive for my tax return?

The school will issue a receipt that includes the school name, district number, taxpayer name, social security number, amount paid, date paid and description of the activity for which the fee was paid.

At Hassayampa Elementary, we currently have several extracurricular activities that we charge a fee. Our approved extracurricular activities are:

- Science Camp for 5th graders,
- Field Trips,
- Character Education,
- Coyote Chorus, Archery, Literacy, and Art Clubs
- Friday Afternoon Program.

You may also choose "**No Preference**". Money in these accounts is discussed during Site Council meetings to determine the extracurricular activity with the greatest need.

Your tax credit donation will be used to provide children the opportunity to participate and also provide supplies, guest speakers, and field trips. If you would like to make a tax credit donation to any of these activities, fill out the enclosed form and send it along with your check to school.
