AZMERIT

Starting on April 1 our school will begin testing students in grades 3- 5. The battery of tests will be given over several days. These are state mandated assessment tools given to all students in grades 3 - 8. The assessment is a standards-based assessment in writing, reading, and math. New this year, 4th grade will be taking the Science test ONLINE – no more paper & pencil testing! **4th graders** will participate in the **4th grade Science AIMS** which will be facilitated on the morning of **MARCH 26**.

Raising Expectations Policy

This district policy was enacted to focus attention on the value of academic achievement and to increase accountability. In order to meet the expectations of this policy, Hassayampa celebrates those students who exceed grade level standards. Additionally, before school and after school tutoring is available for students not meeting the standard.

"Move on When Reading"

Arizona Revised Statute 15-701 states that 3rd graders who score in the lower end of the category of Minimally Proficient on the AzMERIT Reading **will be retained in 3rd grade**. Parents of students whose children are substantially deficient in reading will receive notification. Throughout the year, parents receive information on how Hassayampa teachers are working with their children to get them up to level to pass the 3rd grade AzMERIT. In addition, Hassayampa will provide parents with strategies parents can use to help their children at home. **More information about this statute can be found at www.azed.gov/mowr/.**

The Hassayampa Bike Giveaway!

Math Fact Fluency Goals



Kinder - Count and identify #'s to 100

1st Grade- addition and subtraction facts to 10

2nd Grade - addition & subtraction facts to 20

3rd Grade - addition & subtraction facts and multiplication facts to 10

4th Grade - addition, subtraction & multiplication facts and division facts to 12

5th Grade - addition, subtraction, multiplication, & division facts and fractions/decimals

During the Honors Assembly in March, K-5 students receive tickets. Students have until May to earn their tickets. Tickets will be placed in respective buckets - K-2 - girls, K-2 - boys, 3-5 - girls and 3-5 - boys. The drawing will take place on May 23rd during the annual Hassayampa Special Honors Assembly held at the Webb Center.

Parent Tips to Help Prepare Your Student the AzMERIT Test?

The night before:

- Help your child get to bed on time.
- Keep your normal routine.
- Talk about the test, but don't dwell on it.
- Plan ahead to avoid conflicts in the morning.

The morning of the test:

- Get up early to avoid rushing.
- Eat a good breakfast.
- Be positive about the test.

After the test:

- Talk about the test and how the child felt about it.

March is the Character Counts month of Respect! We teach that showing respect means following The Golden Rule (treat others the way you want to be treated); be accepting of differences; use good manners, not bad language; don't threaten, hurt or hit anyone; be considerate of the feelings of others; and deal peacefully with anger, insults and conflicts.



Respect at home: If your child becomes disrespectful and defiant at times, try offering fixed choices. By letting them choose between one thing or another, they'll still feel like they have some control. For example, say, "You can choose to do either 10 minutes of reading or practice math facts". Some of you may be thinking that they'll say "neither", but you can offer to decide for them if you need to. This usually prompts them to make a choice. One added bonus (shhh!) is you can always make one choice something less than thrilling so they end up picking what you wanted anyway.

Internet Safety Tips From Parenting Magazine:

Keep the Computer in a Central Location

It's much easier to keep tabs on any online activity when the computer is located in a high-traffic zone than if your child is using a computer in the privacy of her own room. Place the computer in a central location like your kitchen or family room so that everything is out in the open.

Urge Your Kids to Avoid Questionnaires, Free Giveaways and Contests

A pop-up ad appears and tells kids they can win a free iPad by simply clicking the link. Anyone would be tempted by this kind of offer, but kids are particularly susceptible, so it's important to warn kids against falling for this kind of Internet trick. Many of these ruses are attempts to glean personal information. Inform kids that even if they are forwarded a fun questionnaire from a friend, it's best to close the window and not participate.

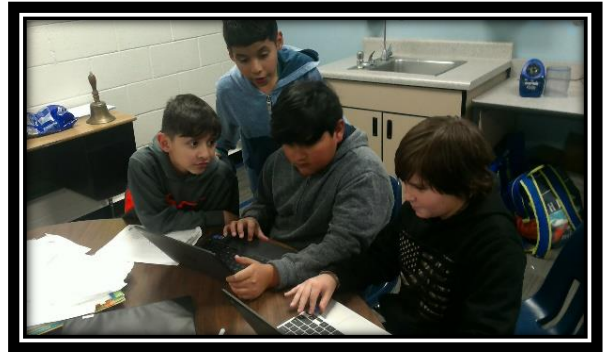


Hassayampa Elementary School 21st Century Community Learning Centers

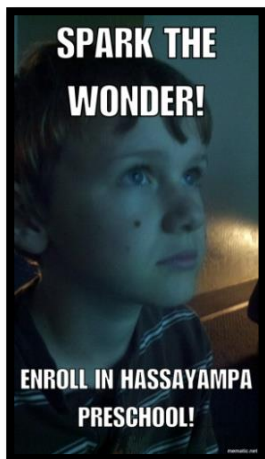

Just a few reminders:

Absences: Regular attendance and being on time to school is critical to your child’s educational success. However, we know that there have been some nasty flu bugs going around. To help your child stay healthy, please make sure that they are getting plenty of rest and eating well. In the event of a necessary absence, please make sure to call the school at 928-684-6750 by 9:00 a.m. If your child becomes ill in the middle of the night, it is okay to call and leave a message. Please indicate your child’s name, your name, the student’s teacher’s name, and the reason for the absence.

Emergency Contact Information: If your address or phone number (work, home, or cell) changes, please let the school office know so that files can be updated. Many times the office or health aide is not able to reach parents when their child is ill. It is a difficult situation for both the student and health aide.

Food Services: If your child purchases breakfast or lunch at school, please make sure that his/her accounts have sufficient funds. You may pay with check or cash. If paying by check, please make it payable to **Wickenburg Unified School District** (no abbreviations) and indicate your child’s name and homeroom teacher in the memo.
